At the top of students' papers, write the subject area and grade for each, e.g., 'Rdng- B, Sci- A'. Collect grades from several workbook pages at a time. This is a useful strategy for grading assignments in workbooks when children aren't supposed to rip the pages out.

First, determine the total number of problems on the quiz, test, exam, or assignment. Then count the number of incorrectly answered problems. Next, subtract the number of wrong problems from the total number of problems. Then divide the result from step 3 by the total number of problems.

In my very limited experience, it takes anywhere from 30 minutes to several hours or days to grade one set of assignments. Multiply that by the number of papers the teacher assigns and how many classes they teach, and it can take up more than 20 hours a week in addition to the normal work hours.

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
